

Haryana State Health Accounts

Haryana State Health Resource Centre (HSHRC) completed the first round of health accounts for the FY 2014-15 in collaboration with USAID funded Health Finance and Governance (HFG) project. Besides HFG project the other key stake holders involved were National Health System Resource Center (NHSRC), Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI), Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh, Health Department, Haryana and National Health Mission (NHM), Haryana. Estimation was conducted using the most recent Systems of Health Accounts (SHA) framework, which was updated in 2011.

Objective

To provide the state with critical information related to health expenditure flows across public, private and external sectors.

Major findings of the report are as follows:-

- Total health expenditure in the state of Haryana including all sources (Government, Private and NGOs) is **Rs. 8,682 crores**. Total population of Haryana for year 2014-15 was 2.67 crores. This equates to expenditure of **Rs. 3,243** on a per capita basis which is almost similar to national figure of Rs 3,638 per capita basis.
- **97%** of health spending is **recurrent**, that is, spending on health goods and services that are consumed within the year. The remaining **3%** of spending is on **capital investment** i.e. spending on goods and services whose benefits are consumed over more than one year.
- Percentage expenditure on health in Haryana is **1.99% of GDP** which includes health expenditure made by all sources on preventive care, inpatient care, outpatient care, ancillary services, administration etc.

- The current health expenditure on health in Haryana is highest by **households (74%)**, followed by **Government (23%)** and Corporations (3%). This level of spending is similar to national figure of 73% by households and 20% by Government. (NHA estimates 2013-14).
- **Household expenditure (74%)** includes:-
 - **45%** of total household spending is on **pharmaceuticals**, 42% on health care services, 7% on laboratory services and 1% on health care goods.
 - Households spend highest on treatment of cancer and cardiovascular diseases.
- **Government spending (23%)** includes:-
 - **National Government schemes** account for nearly **6%** of the spending
 - **13%** via **state-sponsored schemes**.
 - **Employee State Insurance scheme** accounts for **4%** current health expenditure.
- Health care service wise distribution of health expenditure in Haryana:-
 - Curative care reflects major spending of **47%** on **outpatient care** and **40%** on **Inpatient Care**.
 - **Government administration** and management account for **7%** expenditure in Haryana.
 - **Prevention services** account for only **4%** of current health expenditure.
- Disease wise spending in Haryana reflects that:-
 - **Non-communicable diseases** (including diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, respiratory illnesses, cancers) constitute for **26%** of current health expenditure.
 - **Reproductive health** (maternal health & family planning) account for **14%**
 - **Infectious & parasitic diseases** account for **9%**.
